☑ Broadband Infrastructure




Where We Work

How We Work

- Provide Grants and Technical Assistance for community-based organizations, local governments, and Tribal governments to develop and scale local economic transition solutions.
- Convene Network of Peers through annual convening(s) where communities can learn from models and best practices.

City of Becker

Developing a hybrid center to expand access to affordable co-working options for remote workers and professionals act as an accelerator/incubator for entrepreneurs. **Itasca EDC**

In preparation for the closure of the Boswell Energy Center, facilitated a year-long multi-stakeholder planning effort to develop a community action plan

Transition Planning in Becker

Supported early transition planning in response to announced closure of two Sherco units. This included helping secure support from the EDA during the Obama Administration. By starting early, Becker was able attract new businesses years before any units closed.

CEE Report: MN's Power Plant Communities: An Uncertain Future

Supported 2020 study from the Center on Energy and Environment exploring the social and economic implications of MN's energy transition for communities that host power plants.

Past Projects

Midwest Governors Association

Facilitated a process for the Midwest Governors Association to prepare Midwestern communities for power plant closures. Supported MGA in identifying best practices and strategies to support workers and communities, culminating in the 2022 report *Growing the Communities that Have Powered the Midwest.*

MN Transition Policy

In 2019, worked with Coalition of Utility Cities communities to develop strategy and analysis informing state policy addressing coal plant closures.

In 2021, supported development of MN

Business Vitality Council's recommendations for state action to support communities in TRANSITION FUND



Local Economy Lab

New initiative designed to **grow and scale high-impact**, **community-led economic projects**, including those with momentum as a result of recent historic federal investment.

Will provide grants of \$250k-500k and tailored technical assistance for up to 10 projects that:

- Take a place-based approach
- Create an outsized local economic impact
- Can serve as a model for replication in other transitioning coal communities

Timeline. Applications closed. First cohort announced this fall.

Example projects:

- Entrepreneurship & Small Business
 Incubation. Downtown revitalization project
 that attracts and retains local businesses.
- Outdoor Recreation & Tourism. A "rails to trails" project or construction of an ecotourism complex.
- Manufacturing. Attraction of a new battery manufacturing plant that retrains and upskills local workers.
- Coal Plant and Mine Reclamation & Repurposing. Repurposing a shuttered coal plant to promote civic engagement, outdoor recreation, and local business activity.



Get Ready! Challenge

Builds the pipeline of innovative economic development projects in early stages and helps communities plan for plant closures

Organizations will receive:

- Capacity grants
- Tailored technical assistance (expert on-the-ground support) to develop projects
- Support finding public and philanthropic funding sources
- Learning opportunities and peer-to-peer exchange

Timeline. Application expected to open summer 2025
